

A DANGEROUS CROSSING.

Need of Careful Watch at Twenty-ninth and San Jose Avenue.

There is a dangerous crossing at the intersection of **Twenty-ninth street** and San Jose avenue, where the tracks of the San Mateo electric road and the Mission-street road cross each other. Under the rules of street-car traffic the former line has the right of way, and cars of the Mission-street line, as they reach the San Jose avenue tracks, should come to a standstill before crossing in either direction. Thus far this rule has not been followed. The result is that the motormen of the south and north bound cars of the San Mateo line are compelled to use the utmost vigilance to prevent possible accidents. The view of **Twenty-ninth street** west of San Jose avenue is obstructed by buildings at the corners on the west side, and a car might reach the crossing without being seen in time to avoid a collision. Orders have been issued to the motormen of the San Mateo line to proceed with much care in either direction when the crossing is reached. As yet the motormen on the new line do not seem to heed the rule of the road in this particular so far as the right-of-way proposition is concerned.
