COURT NOTES.

Patrick Mitchell has applied for letters of administration on the \$7000 estate of his deceased wife, Bridget Mitchell.

The will of John H. Bolton, filed for probate yesterday, bequeaths an estate of unknown value to his five children.

Warren Evans has sued Mary C. Bulsom to recover \$1200 alleged to be due for seven years' board and lodging at \$15 a month.

Suits for divorce have been commenced by Annie Carpmill against John Carpmill and by Sarah B. Jones against Charles F. Jones.

Sini Brizzolara has sued Carper Stein to dissolve a partnership in the livery stable business and for an accounting. The defendant is said to have excluded his partner from the business and to have misappropriated the receipts.

James K. Polk has sued Adolph Boyken, druggist, to recover \$5000 damages. He went to Boyken's drug store to have a sore finger dressed. He says that the finger was not properly dressed and that in consequence he was incapacitated from business for four weeks.

Joseph McClellan, an ex-convict, was yesterday sentenced by Judge Bahrs to seven years' imprisonment at San Quentin for an attempted burglary. In Judge Belcher's court Robert Johnson was sentenced to three months' imprisonment in the County Jail for an assault.

Leonard Grover brought suit yesterday to have it decreed that he does not owe any money to B. W. Bates. He says that Bates is threatening him with suit and attachment on the box receipts of the plaintiff's theater. Grover declares that he does not owe the defendant as much as a single dollar.
